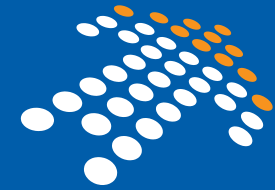

**COMMUNITY TRANSPORT FOR
NORTHERN SYDNEY**

This brochure provides information on “Easy Transport” options for people living independently at home in Northern Sydney who may have difficulties with transport because they are frail aged over 65 years or have a disability.



Community Transport

Community Transport services are designed for:

- frail aged people over 65 years
- younger people with disabilities
- and the carers of these people

Community Transport services are provided by cars and minibuses for purposes such as medical appointments, shopping and social outings.

Passengers are transported door-to-door by drivers trained to provide a supportive service for frail aged and disabled clients, and many of the vehicles used are wheelchair accessible.

How to access Community Transport:

Contact your local Community Transport provider to arrange an over-the-phone assessment to see whether you are eligible to receive their services.

Once you are registered, each time transport is required, a booking must be made with your local Community Transport provider.

Cost of Community Transport Services:

Community Transport providers are not-for-profit organisations that receive federal and state government funding as part of the Home and Community Care (HACC) Program.

Community Transport providers charge passengers a small fee for services. However clients are not denied a service if they are unable to pay.

Carers can accompany a frail aged or disabled passenger at no extra cost.

Disabled Alternative Road Travel Service (DARTS)

Provides shopping trips and social outings for adults who use wheelchairs. Door-to-door transport is provided in small buses that are equipped to take up to 5 wheelchairs.
